ACCB Provides Relief: The Affordable Child Care Benefit is providing relief to families and is available to thousands of B.C. families with a yearly pre-tax household income of up to \$111,000 and can save families up to \$15,000 a year, per child, on the cost of child care. Note: Applying for ACCB is a FREE process, please beware of those who are asking for a fee to help you apply. Contact your local CCRR for assistance or call ACCB Toll Free 1-888-338-6622.

Claim Forms: Child Care Providers... did you know you can use your cellular phone to take a picture of your Affordable Child Care Benefit claim form and email to <u>ACCBClaims@gov.bc.ca</u>? This is the preferred method and the quickest way to receiving payment, however, you can still fax and mail in your claim forms.

When to Submit Claim Forms?: Licensed Not Required send in their claim forms by the 7th of the current month. Registered Licensed Not Required and Licensed Child Care submit their claim forms on the 15th of the month prior. (Example for July Care the claim form is sent in June 15)

BCeID: Have you signed up for a BCeID yet? A BCeID is an account that provides secure electronic access to online government services. Update your ACCB information right from home! Take a picture with your phone and have it instantly upload instead of being back logged with being faxed. Fee Reduction: The Child Care Fee Reduction Initiative lowers the cost of child care for parents each month. Parents do not need to apply for the fee reduction. New applications from child care centres are still being accepted. Summer Weather Tips from Health Link BC

- Try to keep toddlers and children out of the sun during the peak hours of 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. This is when the sun is the strongest. When you are outside, look for trees and other naturally shady areas for children to play.
- Look at the weather on a daily basis to see what the sun's UV rating is.
- If you cannot keep your child out of the sun, make sure to protect their skin with "sun smart" clothing, a hat and sunscreen.
- Dermatologists strongly recommend a sunscreen with UVA and UVB protection and a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of 30 or more if you and your child are out in the sun.
- Apply sunscreen 30 minutes before exposure to the sun so it is absorbed by the skin and less likely to rub or wash off. Re-apply every two hours.



Encourage your child to drink plenty of water.

INGREDIENTS

1 cup pitted dates or prunes 1/4 cup unsweetened shredded coconut 1/4 cup hemp hearts or sesame seeds 2 Tbsp cocoa powder 1/2 cup rolled oats 1/2 cup seed or nut butter (dependent on any allergy restrictions)

Energy Balls

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Soak the dates in boiling water for 30 minutes then drain (reserving the liquid) and puree in a food processor, adding the soaking liquid as needed to form a puree.

2. Add all remaining ingredients to the dates and process until a thick dough is formed.

3. Roll into balls (this can be fun to have kids help with!) and put on a tray to eat!



HEALTHY EATING & PHYSICAL ACTIVITY IN THE EARLY YEARS



Equipment

1 ribbon stick or canning ring for each child

Physical Activity

Developing movement skills (body and spatial awareness, rhythm, timing); creativity; social skills (leading)

WRIGGLY RIBBONS

How to Play

- 1. With the children, hold the end of the ribbon stick or the canning ring and practice making patterns (e.g. figure 8, waves, rainbow, spiral, circle, wiggle).
- 2. Show the children how to use the whole arm, the lower arm (from the elbow) or just the wrist, to make the ribbon move. Change hands.
- Invite the children to act out ideas using their ribbons (e.g. pretend it's a windshield wiper, a tornado, a bicycle wheel, a wiggly snake, etc.).
